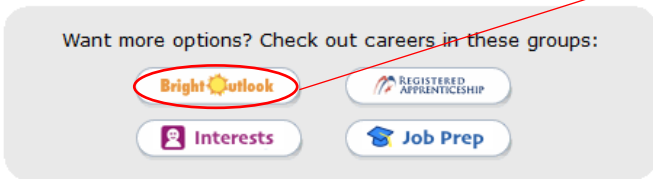

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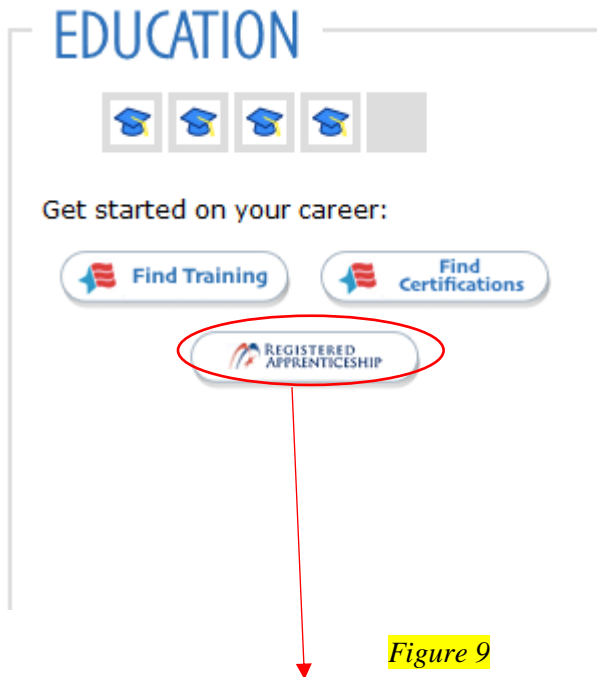

- The last two tools are the “Interest” assessment and the “Job Prep” tool that operate just as they did in Tutorial 1.

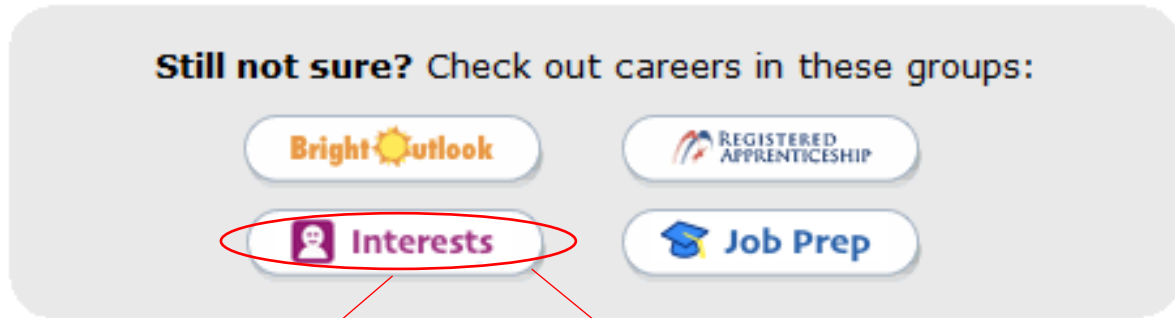

- First, users can pick from the list of 6 “Interest” options, choosing the interest that best fits the user, or the user can utilize the “O*Net Interest Profiler” to determine which interest best fit the user based upon the user’s response to a series of questions. When a user selects an interest, careers will be presented that fit that interest profile. We’ll use “Realistic.”

REALISTIC

People with **Realistic** interests like work activities that include practical, hands-on problems and answers. They like working with plants and animals, and real-world materials, like wood, tools, and machinery. They enjoy outside work.

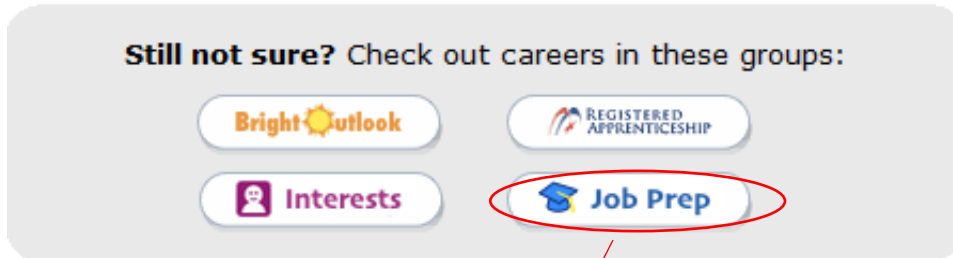

Job Zone Three: Medium Preparation Needed

Experience	Training	Education
Previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is needed for these careers. For example, an electrician must be in an apprenticeship for three to four years or have several years of job training. You may need to pass a test to get a license to do the job.	Employees in these careers need one or two years of training. Both on-the-job experience and informal training with experienced workers may be needed. An apprenticeship program may be a good choice for these careers.	Most of these careers need vocational school training, on-the-job experience, or an associate's degree.
